11h00 – 13h00	The Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA), No.4 of 2013 came into effect on 01 July 2021. The Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf) is facilitating the process to develop a Code of Conduct for Research under POPIA. Within the research setting, POPIA regulates the processing of personal information for research purposes, and the flow of data across South Africa's borders to ensure that any limitations on the right to privacy are justified and aimed at protecting other important rights and interests. nGAP Seminar: 'Fishers' rights are human rights'

The discussion is based on the case note published in the South African Journal on Human Rights, Special Issue on Class Action Litigation in South 37:1, 126-139, (2021), entitled 'Fishers' rights are human rights': George v Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism 2005 (6) SA 297.

In 2004, artisanal fishers, community-based and non-governmental organisations representing approximately 5,000 artisanal fishers from various fishing communities sought relief inter alia under the Promotion of Equality and Prevention of Unfair Discrimination Act 4 of 2000 as a result of the unfair discrimination against them because of the fisheries legal framework. This discussion will focus on this unique class action brought by the fishers in the Equality Court and the decisions resulting from the case. The relief sought by the fishers to remedy the discrimination and inequity was to compel the then Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism to make proper and adequate provision for artisanal fishers in terms of the fisheries legal framework, giving them equitable access to marine resources alongside other marine resource users. The discussion will also briefly look at the impact of the order of the Equality Court, as it served as the trigger to transform small-scale fisheries in South Africa and the human-rights-centred themes reflected in the South African Small-Scale Fisheries Policy and considers the extent to which this policy is aligned to the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation's Small-Scale Fisheries Guidelines of 2015.
